

## Watercolour Materials

*This list is a SUGGESTIONS only and if you already have watercolour equipment it may well be very suitable so please bring it along on the first week.*

### Watercolour Brushes:

Princeton 9650 Snap are a good beginners brush (or similar)

Round brushes – say a number 12, and 6,

1 Flat brush Stroke ¾"

1 Oval ¾"

1 Liner number 2

1 Hake brush about 30-40mm

### Palette:

Plastic is best for leaving home so whilst plastic white plates work well a palette with a lid is ideal so you can easily keep unused pigment at the end of your painting sessions. i.e. Monte Marte Airtight Large or Art Spectrum Colour Keeper

### Water Pots:

I use two one should ideally stay clean and the other for cleaning. Plastic jars like the type used for fruit with a screw lid are ideal. Don't need the lid just the jars. Do not bring glass

### Paper:

This is one area that it is best to invest in. Good quality paper 300gsm (140lb) is available in sheets which you can cut to your size or in pads or blocks. We will use smaller pieces to start off with. (Cheaper paper (light in weight and quality) will give you poor results and you will be disappointed with your progress.

For "real" paintings I recommend Arches or Saunders Waterford Cold Press also known as NOT or medium. It has some grain and ideal for all sorts of subjects. These sheets can be torn in half/quarters and smaller. A full sheet is around \$11-15.

### Paints:

**Buy what you feel you can afford but best results do come from using artists grade.**

I use pigment by Winsor & Newton, Daniel Smith and Art Spectrum but there are other artist grade manufacturers.

**Art Spectrum are Australian and well priced**

**As a minimum** please bring 7 colours

1 each of a Warm Red, Blue and Yellow and 1 each of a Cool Red, Blue and Yellow and Burnt Sienna

### Board:

A support to hold your paper when you paint. Corflute sheet is ideal available from Bunnings etc. Can be cut to size. It cannot be masonite type unless it has been sealed as the water will get into it and it wont stay flat. Ideal size is 50cm x 40cm
